

Customer Case Study: Wal-Mart

Swift Delivery of Class-A Facility for Retailer's New Market E-Commerce Entrance

Opportunity

Wal-Mart had ambitious e-commerce objectives for Brazil, an emerging market for the retailer. To support its goals, Wal-Mart required a new Class-A e-commerce logistics facility with marketleading features, including security. In addition, to compete with other e-retailers in the country, the new building needed to be fully operational before the start of the peak holiday season.

Challenge

The Wal-Mart team was tasked with navigating the country's laws, business customs and language while locating a suitable property. At the time, Brazil was experiencing rapid growth in the e-commerce sector, driving increased demand for Class-A facilities and making the right property hard to find.

Solution
